- To increase the amount of information about local matters of concern such as updates on Archway planning, Islington's development plans or Police news.
  - To reduce the number of separate pages and get rid of overlap in content.
  - To keep the Newsletter as a separate publication and remove it as an attachment to the website.

We will keep you informed on progress and in the meantime you can continue to access the old site. Once updated, I hope you will let us know what you think of it.
