Archway gyratory improvements: main works planned to start from 29 February 2016

We are transforming the Archway gyratory to make the town centre a more pleasant, accessible and safe environment for all road users.

As you may be aware, we have tailored our works programme this month, while National Grid Gas have been replacing a gas main near Highgate Tube station. As these gas works are due for completion shortly, I am writing to let you know that the main works for the Archway gyratory project are planned to start on Monday 29 February 2016.

Works planned from Monday 29 February 2016

Planned from 29 February – 12 March 2016

- We will be working to remove existing traffic islands near the junction of Archway Road and Tollhouse Way
- Archway Road and Tollhouse Way will remain open at all times, although temporary lane closures will apply
- The bus lane at the southern end of Archway Road will be temporarily suspended.

Planned from 9 March – late April 2016

- We will complete kerb and drainage works near Tollhouse Way and start work to construct a new slip road into Flowers Mews
- Local access and space for deliveries will be maintained for businesses in the centre of the gyratory. However, there will be no on-street parking in Flowers Mews during these works
- o Temporary lane closures will apply on Tollhouse Way.

Planned from mid to late March 2016

- We will remove a traffic island at the Archway Road and St John's Way junction
- o Temporary lane closures will be in place on Archway Road and St John's Way
- A bus lane approaching the gyratory on St John's Way will be temporarily suspended
- We will be in touch with local residents and businesses nearer the time with more details about this phase of works.

Travel advice

Roads in the area will be busier while the works take place. Please plan ahead and allow more time to complete your journeys, especially when travelling during peak periods (07:00-09:00 & 16:30-19:30 weekdays, and 10:00-19:00 at weekends) or consider alternative routes, where possible.

We will keep pedestrian crossings open where possible, although temporary diversions will be clearly signed where needed. Please follow the signage to the nearest alternative crossing points.

Working hours

Construction will typically take place on Monday to Friday between 07:30 and 18:00, and on Saturday between 08:00 and 12:00. Quieter works may also take place at night to complete the project as quickly as possible.
