When we had last had a public meeting in March this year Whitehall Park School was only a name.

NOW it has had a very successful first half term in its temporary accommodation and the School already has a positive identity in the community.

Last March Islington's claim on half the School's grounds for housing was still being considered by the Department for Education

NOW it has been announced that the DfE has agreed to those plans to squash the School into half the site At the last public meeting there was overwhelming support for a judicial review if the DfE agreed to

Islington's 51% land grab. ASAG took the first steps towards launching that judicial review.

NOW the judicial review process is under way and we are reporting back to you on progress.

Islington's Executive tried as hard as they could to stop the School opening.

Now they seem to have strong-armed the DfE into giving up most of

the school playground – leaving the new school with just half the playspace recommended for children in the Department's own 2014 Guidelines!

Of course more housing is needed in London – but does that mean that children should suffer tiny playgrounds when the necessary space is already there? Islington has the smallest amount of open space of any London Borough, which makes it all the more important for children to be able to play outside when they are at school.

The DfE's published Guidelines mean the whole Ashmount site will be needed when the school is fully open. In an attempt to make up for the lack of playspace a rooftop playing area is proposed on top of the school, but even with that the space available is woefully short.
